
021 was a year of new challenges and opportunities for the Conservancy, bringing the most significant change since the organization was founded in 1994: the establishment of our first nature reserve and permanent headquarters in Beach Lake, PA.

The I44-acre **Van Scott Nature Reserve** was donated to the Conservancy by the Van Scott family in May 2020 and officially opened to the public in October 2021, featuring more than three miles of walking trails through wildflower meadows, wetlands, and forests with scenic views to the foothills of the Catskills and High Point in New Jersey. The Reserve is now home to the Conservancy's year-round educational programming including nature walks, forestry and land management workshops, demonstration projects, and winter Eagle Watch. Over time, other farm structures will be adapted for new and enhanced educational programs.

The Conservancy's continued growth would not be possible without the dedicated support of our members, volunteers, and friends. In 2021, our volunteers donated countless hours of their personal time serving on committees, on our Board of Directors, or working on the Van Scott Nature Reserve as we prepared to open. Although the pandemic prevented our winter Eagle Watch season, thousands of people joined us online for our virtual educational programs, and, later in the year, for guided walks outdoors at the Reserve.

We are looking forward to a full calendar of events in 2022 and are deeply grateful to all those who continued to support the Conservancy, whether by contributing to a fundraising appeal, participating in the photo contest, bidding on an item in the online auction, or joining us for a beautiful evening outdoors at Woodloch for our Back to Nature Celebration in September. Despite facing their own challenges this year, the local businesses in the Green Lodging Partnership and Drinks for the Delaware together contributed nearly \$60,000 toward local conservation in 2021, directly helping to protect the land, water, and wildlife of our region.

Thank you for being part of our community and for your investment in a healthy, sustainable future.

Good News from the Upper Delaware River Region

Whether it's the resident pairs that build nests, raise their young, and live here year-round or the hundreds that flock here in the winter in search of clean water to fish and large stands of trees for perching and roosting, the bald eagles that share our region are thriving. The Upper Delaware River region is one of the largest wintering habitats for eagles in the northeast United States, and protected lands provide the safe habitat the eagles need, now and for future generations.

Scholarships Supporting Local Students
