n 2024, the Delaware Highlands Conservancy celebrated our 30th anniversary and more than 19,000 acres of working farms and forests, clean waters, and wildlife habitat protected to date. It was a busy and fulfilling year as we continued to engage with our community through popular programs at the Van Scott Nature Reserve and across the region. In 2024, we completed a comprehensive Strategic Planning process, guided by input from our community about their goals and vision for a sustainable future for our area. A Century of Impact

Celebrating Barbara Yeaman's Conservation Legacy

n December 16th, 2024, the Delaware Highlands Conservancy's beloved founder, Barbara Yeaman, celebrated her 100th birthday.

Barbara founded the Conservancy thirty years ago, in 1994. Since those early days, the organization has grown from a small group of dedicated volunteers to a prominent organization with offices on both sides of the Delaware River and more than 19,000 acres of farms and forests, clean waters, and wildlife habitat protected to date.

In honor of Barbara's 100th birthday and the decades that she has dedicated to protecting the lands and waters we all cherish—while inspiring generations of others to do the same—the Conservancy established the Barbara Yeaman Fund for Land Conservation. The fund will assist landowners with the costs associated with protecting their land with a conservation easement and will support the Conservancy in offering educational programs on conservation and sustainable land management.

Protecting Land and Celebrating Community



Rose Valley Forest, 18 acres of forests and wetlands in Sullivan County, NY, is now permanently protected with a conservation easement. The property has been owned by the MacAdam family for 150 years, and brothers Gordon and Henry MacAdam had previously worked with the Conservancy in 2012 to protect 26 acres of their family homestead. Their positive experience partnering with the Conservancy and stewarding the land over the past twelve years motivated them to extend their conservation legacy.

In October, we were thrilled to cut the ribbon on a new exit driveway at the Van Scott Nature Reserve. The existing driveway and parking area was previously too small to accommodate buses and oversized transportation vehicles. With the construction of this new, larger exit drive, the Reserve now has the capacity to host visiting school buses and other large groups. The construction project was generously supported by local community grant funders including The Honesdale National Bank Foundation, the Human Resources Foundation, Pocono Mountains Visitors Bureau, and the Wayne County Community Foundation.

In a pilot program, the Conservancy is **now allowing leashed dogs on the Wildflower Trail at the Van Scott Nature Reserve**. The trail can be accessed by following the Explorer Trail a few feet from the main parking lot, and is marked with the dog symbol. Dogs must be leashed at all times, and leashes are free to borrow from the dog station during your visit. The station also includes waste bags and a trash can.
